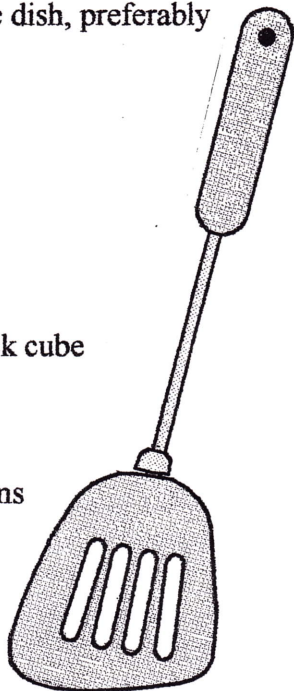
## COOKERY SECTION.

The best recipe ever for Spaghetti Bolognaise in your microwave. By R. Ward.

You will need a 2 litre microwave dish, preferably pottery with a lid.

### Ingredients:

1 stick celery, chopped  
 1 carrot, chopped  
 1 onion, chopped  
 2 rashers bacon, chopped small  
 250 – 500 gms mince (beef)  
 1 1/2 cups water with chicken stock cube  
 1 400gm tin chopped tomatoes  
 1 – 1 1/2 tablespoons plain flour  
 4 tablespoons tomato paste  
 1 small tin champignon mushrooms  
 salt  
 pepper  
 parsley  
 basil



### Method:

Boil up to 500gm spaghetti in a saucepan according to directions on packet.

Combine celery, carrot, onion, bacon, garlic in the microwave covered dish for 7 minutes, stirring after 4 minutes.

Stir, add mince, tomatoes, tomato paste, flour and water with added stock. Microwave for 10 minutes, covered.

Stir, add tinned mushrooms, herbs and seasonings for 7 minutes, covered

Stir and serve with the spaghetti and some grated parmesan cheese.

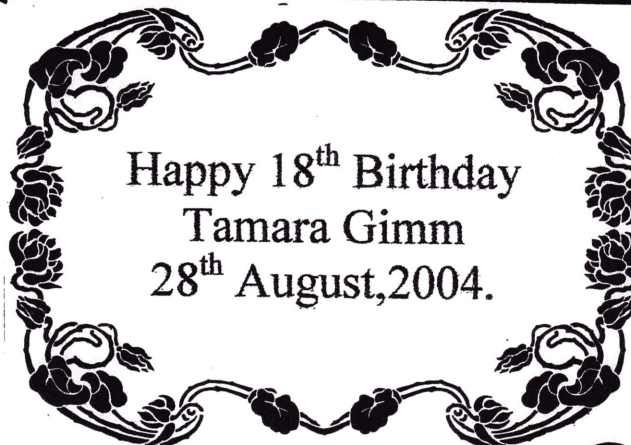
Cheerios are red in colour and are short but fat little sausages.
