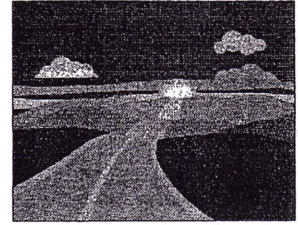

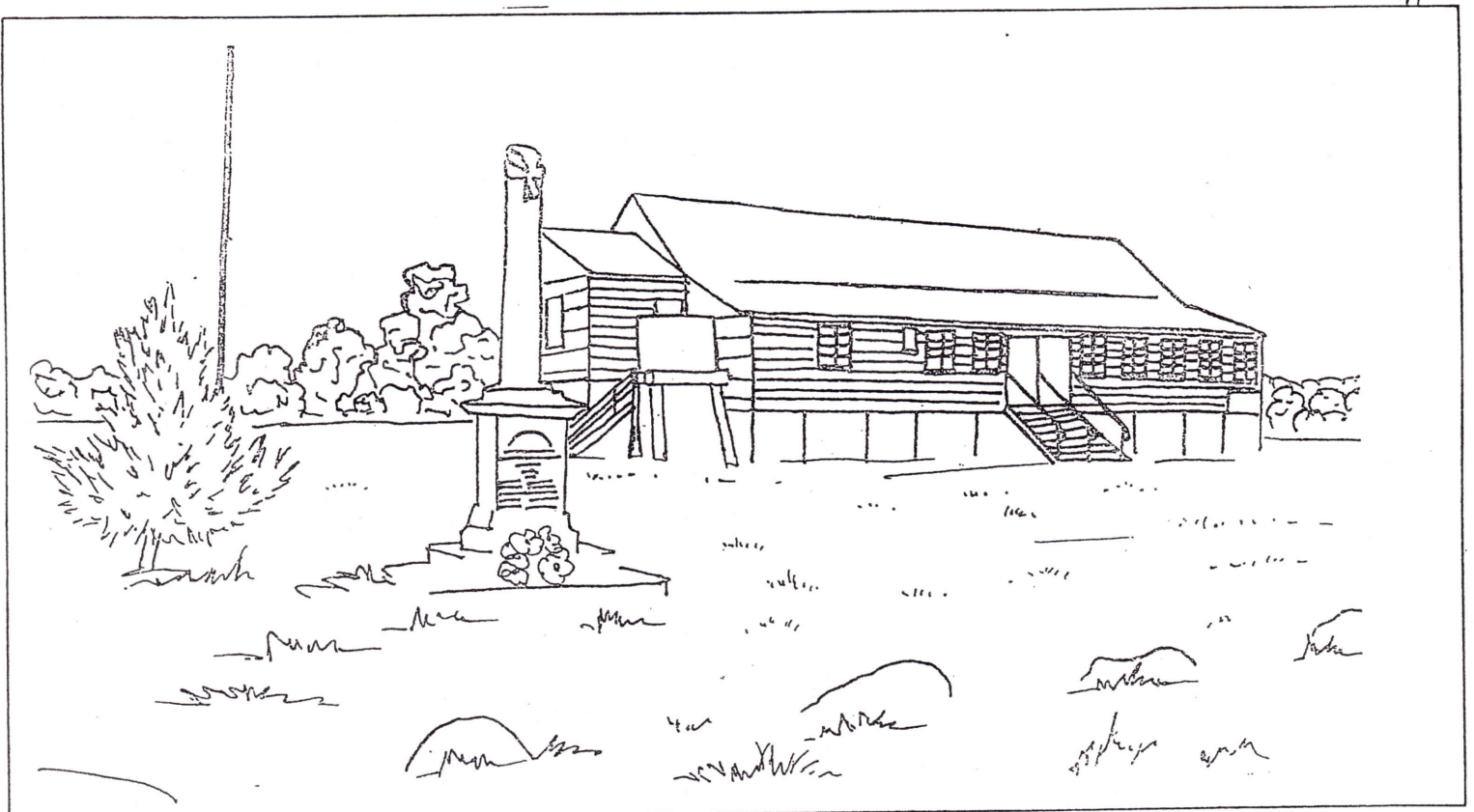

JANET EDMINSTONE STEWART was born on the 19<sup>th</sup> December 1918 at Renfrew, Scotland. Father Thomas Miller Stewart and mother Janet Edminstone McMurdo both died when she was very young. In 1930 with her brother Allan she came to Australia to live with her Aunt and Uncle Mr. And Mrs. McMurdo at Ivy Bank Calioran, finishing her school days there, first at Mr. And Mrs. Smith's house, then the Calioran school was built. For the next few years she did jobs around the district helping out when the need for family care arose. Then she went to Mr. and Mrs. Hunt at Bouldercombe and later they moved back to Ridgeland. In her younger days she enjoyed her game of tennis at Bouldercombe with the Armstrong and Childs girls. While living in the Calioran district she joined the CWA and was secretary for a time, the Calioran CWA used to meet in the McKenzie's home. On the 11<sup>th</sup> December 1946 Jenny married Jack Jones in the John Knox Presbyterian Church Bolsover Street Rockhampton and they went to live on "Forest Home" which was home for the rest of her life. 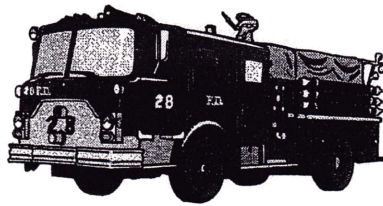
