To the men of the community: we send out a challenge for you to grow a 'mo' or be involved in Movember, remember all funds raised go towards mens' cancer.

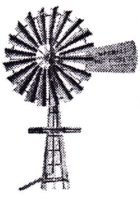
To the women of the community: we apologise in advance for any beard rash...

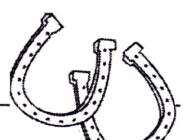

BE PREPARED



Be Informed

It is important to stay informed and aware of what is happening in your area.

TUNE IN, LOG ON, LISTEN OUT AND ACT!

TUNE IN

To your local radio and TV station to listen for warnings and weather updates and local community safety announcements.

LOG ON

To the internet to get up-to-date and accurate information. Use reliable sources such as the Rockhampton Regional Council Website as it will contain local information on the emergency, information on the evacuation centres and evacuation routes and information on assistance after the disaster. There are further websites listed in the contacts section of this booklet.

LISTEN OUT

Emergency Services and Rockhampton Regional Council utilise different methods of ensuring the community is promptly warned. They have specific systems in place that you should be aware of.

The Standard Emergency Warning Signal (SEWS): the siren sound used at the beginning of serious warnings on radio and television. Pay careful attention to the message that follows SEWS and act immediately on the advice given.

Emergency Alerts: these are the voice messages to your landline and text messages to your mobile telephone based on the location of the billing address held by the telephone service company.

Loud-hailers: megaphones are mounted on vehicles playing announcements informing the areas they drive through of important information.

Door-knocks: Emergency Services' personnel may door-knock your local area to pass on warnings.

The information in the warnings can mean further action is required. Ensure all householders are aware of the warning and advice provided. Check on neighbours and friends who may need special assistance or may not be aware of the warnings. If a disaster is imminent you may need to activate your Emergency Plan. The sooner you are aware, the sooner you can act and lessen the risks.

LEMON SOUR CREAM CAKE

125g butter, softened
 1 cup caster sugar
 2 eggs
 1 lemon, zest and juice
 1 cup self-raising flour, sifted
 ½ cup sour cream
 Icing sugar, to dust
 Thick cream to serve



Preheat oven to moderately slow, 160 degrees C. Lightly grease and line a 20cm square cake pan with baking paper.

In a bowl, using an electric mixer, beat butter and sugar together until pale and creamy. Add eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition. Beat in zest.

Fold in flour alternately with combined cream and lemon juice. Pour into pan. Bake 35-40 minutes, until cooked when tested. Cool in pan 5 minutes before turning out onto a wire rack to cool. Dust with icing sugar and serve with a dollop of cream.

Gardening for November

Things are hotting up in the garden in November!

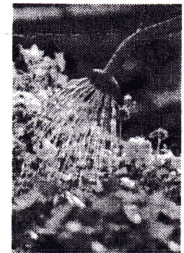
Vegies to sow in November – Sweet corn - Sweet corn plants don't really like being transplanted so it's best to sow seeds direct into well prepared garden beds. Plenty of manure and fertiliser dug into the soil before planting will help to ensure success.

Flowers to sow in November – Marigolds - Cheery, warmth-loving annuals, marigolds add bright touches of yellow and orange to summer gardens. But they also have some valuable pest-repelling properties. The strong marigold smell is said to confuse flying insect pests, thereby driving them away and preventing them from attacking garden plants.


Feed in November - Liquid Fertiliser is the ideal food to keep summer vegies (especially hungry corn) growing well. You're looking to improve soil and, at the same time, promote vigorous and healthy growth.

November pest watch - Tomatoes are very susceptible to diseases so it's critically important to protect them by regularly dusting the plants.

November job file - If you haven't already done so, spray your lawn with weed spray to protect it from the nasty, root-eating curl grubs that attack the grass during the warm weather. And, just as importantly, if you haven't yet fed your lawn do it this weekend.

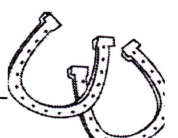
This month in history:

November 1, 1848 - The first medical school for women opened in Boston. The Boston Female Medical School was founded by Samuel Gregory with just twelve students. In 1874, the school merged with the Boston University School of Medicine, becoming one of the first co-ed medical schools.

November 10, 1871 - Explorer Henry M. Stanley found missionary David Livingstone at Ujiji, Africa. Stanley began his search the previous March for Livingstone who had been missing for two years. Upon locating him, he simply asked, "Dr. Livingstone, I presume?"

November 14, 1666 - The first experimental blood transfusion took place in Britain, utilizing two dogs.

November 22, 1963 - At 12:30 p.m., on Elm Street in downtown Dallas, President John F. Kennedy's motorcade slowly approached a triple underpass. Shots rang out. The President was struck in the back, then in the head. He was rushed to Parkland Memorial Hospital where fifteen doctors tried to save him. At 1 p.m., John Fitzgerald Kennedy, 35th President of the United States, was pronounced dead. On board Air Force One, at 2:38 p.m., Lyndon B. Johnson was sworn in as the 36th President.

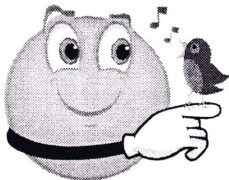
